


Seal are the most important aspect of an Inuit diet and is often the largest part of an Inuit hunters diet. Animals were lake trout, Arctic cod and seal.

For centuries, the Inuit were a nomadic people who spent their time hunting and fishing, but today they have become sedentary. There are more than half a million Inuit in Canada, most of whom now live in urban centers like Inuvik, which has a population of about 3,500.

Greenland has an arctic climate. About 80% of the land is covered by an ice sheet that is up to 3 km thick, while the ice-free land areas are limited to coastal.





