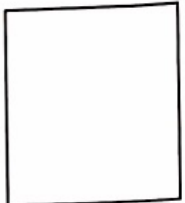

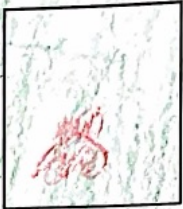

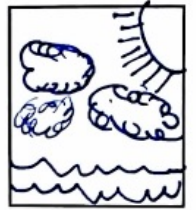

# Life of the Inuits

For centuries, the Inuit were a nomadic people who spent their time hunting and fishing, but today they have become sedentary. There are more than 23,000 Inuit in the Arctic region, and about 40% are employed in government jobs.



Inuit life  
The average Arctic winter temperature has been  $-30^{\circ}\text{C}$ , while the average Arctic summer temperature is  $8^{\circ}\text{C}$  -  $54^{\circ}\text{C}$ .

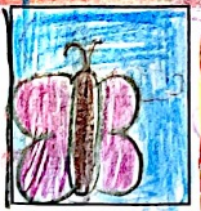

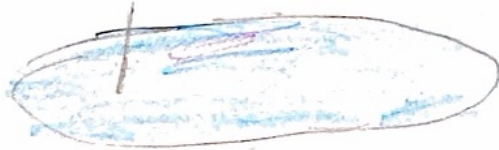
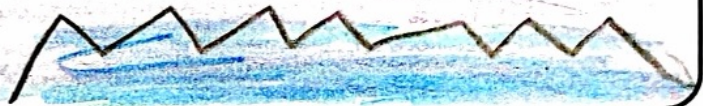
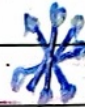
Greenland has an arctic climate. About 80% of the land is covered by an ice sheet that is up to 3km thick, while the ice-free land areas are limited to coastal.

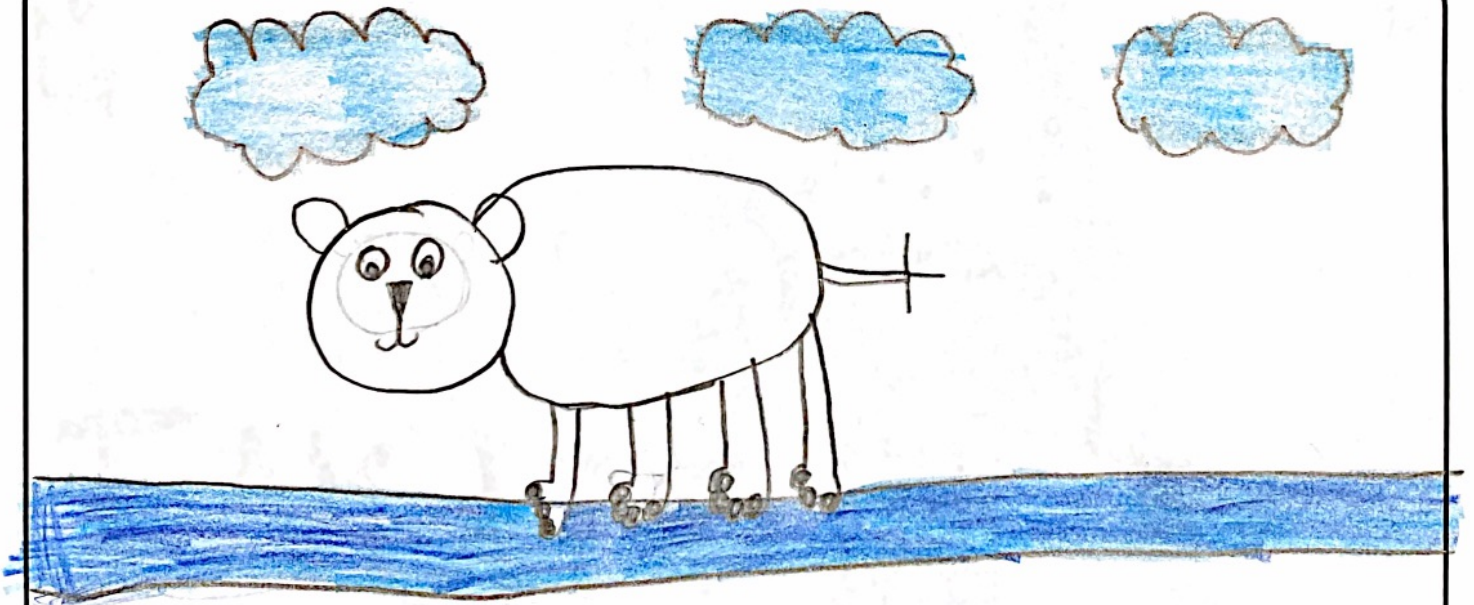

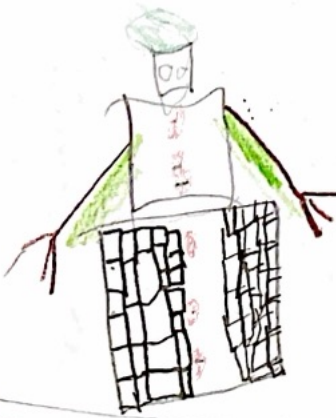

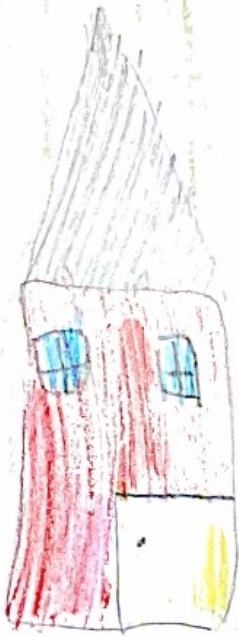


Greenland is one of the biggest places in the world, and yet very little of it is known to the outside world. In fact many people still have misconceptions about the beautiful Arctic nation.

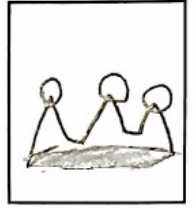


In 982,

F2 Greenlandic part of the Inuit-Yupik-unagon language group is spoken by 57,000 people.

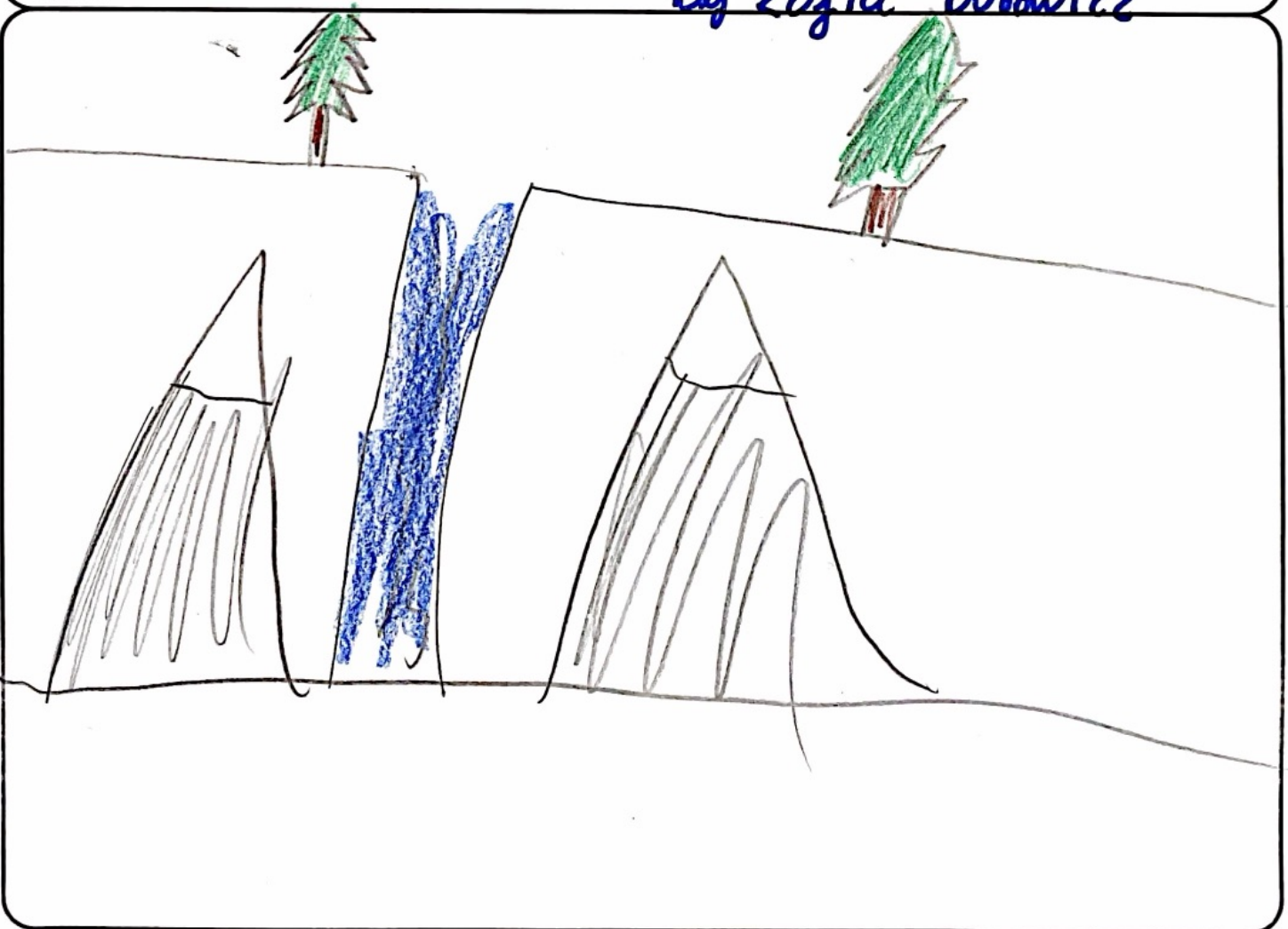

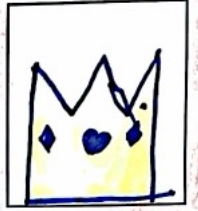
