

## **HOW TO FIND US**

#### **Reading Museum**

Reading Museum is in the Town Hall opposite the rear entrance to Marks & Spencer. The entrance is via glass doors on Blagrave Street, a two minute walk from the railway station and main bus stops.

We recommend using public transport or park and ride to reach central Reading.

#### **Reading Abbey Quarter**

We suggest you begin your visit at Reading Museum to see our permanent Reading Abbey displays.

The Ruins are a 5 to 10 minute walk away. They can be accessed via the Forbury Gardens or from Chestnut Walk beside the River Kennet.

#### Riverside Museum

The Riverside Museum is about a 20 minute walk from Reading Museum. It is accessible from Kenavon Drive or from the Kings Road via Gasworks Road bridge.
